New Business

Minutes of Previous Meeting: On **Motion** duly made and seconded, the minutes of the previous board meeting were **approved**.

Main Gate Signage: Agreed to add “Spectators Welcome” to main gate signage.

Fuel for Training Planes: Geordan advises we have plenty of fuel on hand.

Create PayPal Account: **Motion** by Geordan W, second by Andrew W: The Treasurer is authorized and instructed to create a PayPal account on behalf of AMOS and to link said PayPal account with the club’s checking account at Umaqua Bank. The Treasurer shall administer said PayPal account, and the President shall have access to said PayPal account for all necessary action. **Motion passed.**

Float Fly Report: John S reported it was windy every day except Saturday, but everyone had a good time. Thanks to Basil for taking photos and to Mike for taking registration.

Warbird Event Status Report: Dave L reported on all the preparations that have been made. We could use some volunteers to help out, but are ready to go. Basil and Geordan are the directors.

Field Projects Report: Dave L reported the shade support truss project is going forward. He has added interior lights, solar power and an alarm to the AMOS container. He will program the Alarm to arm itself at 9:00 PM daily.

New Toys: Dave L reported he has purchased a new John Deere Mower and an ATV which he will house at the field and which the club is free to use. They remain Dave’s property. He will equip the ATV with water tanks and a fire extinguisher.

More Gravel To Be Added: Dave L reported that the amount of gravel on the new parking area is thinner than desirable and would require adding more eventually. He proposed that if the club will

purchase 20 yards of AB for the parking area, he will purchase another 20 yards at his expense to cover the last grassy areas. **Motion** by Doug K, second by John S, to accept said proposal provided (1) the cost to the Club shall not exceed \$1,000, and (2) the expenditure is approved by the membership at the next General Meeting. **Motion Passed.**

Warbirds Over Roseville 2021 – June 12th

This years Warbirds over Roseville event had a fantastic turnout and was a great collaboration between AMOS volunteers that produced a Top Notch Event. I really enjoyed being a part of this years event. The Event was teaming with High Level R/C Pilots and amazed spectators.

We were lucky and got some good weather on the event day. Both Friday and Sunday were very windy days but Saturday was left alone to 5- 8 mph winds. Not too much heat either it only got to 90 deg.

The wind was crossing the runway at times moving South West.

The event made \$512 in Profit. \$302 from food sales and \$210 from Pilot registration. There might be more expenses like the extra Porta Poty that will cut into that amount but it was still very profitable.

The BBQ featured Filet Magnon and Pulled Pork and the usual Hamburgers, Hot links and Hotdogs. French fries added a nice touch.







Transmitter Case Foam Reinforcement

Transmitter and device storage cases keep your equipment protected but the foam inside can start to go to pieces and break apart.

The pelican type of cases where you pick out the foam and make your own spaces based on the size of what your storing, can start to shed little squares of foam and ruin your nice fit.

Researching on how to fix this problem I happened on to the Plastic Dip Product which is a Plastic compound spray. Available at any hardware store for around \$8. Comes in Black which matches most cases.

You spray it into the foam layers saturating them with the liquid plastic. This has to be done in stages and rubber gloves and a mask should be used – outside is best. If the case has removable layers of the foam take them out and spray them separately at first saturate them with the spray and return them to the case so they can stick together. After that keep spraying the Plastic Dip until you use up the whole can. Let dry in between spraying sessions. Any loose foam squares just spray them and put them back in.



It can be messy and takes a while to dry. Let it dry overnight. Rub a piece of paper in the case to make sure the plastic has dried. Return your equipment into the case. My opinion – it's worth the improvement for \$8. The foam is more firm and stays in place but not so hard that it can scratch the equipment.
