



AMOS April 2022 Newsletter

Board Meeting Recap – 7pm 4/4/2021 Zoom Call 7pm

Motion #1 - Approve Drone Racing and Practice at the new area set aside at the AMOS field which is designated for both Drone and Helicopter use. This motion is good for one year, as a trial period and will be reevaluated in May of 2023. Tommy Rico is in charge of targeting youth groups, preparing the site for events, monitoring the Drone Membership and approving only Drone Pilots he has interviewed.

Motion #2 - Approve up to \$1,500 to be provided to Dave Long as reimbursement costs (for our 4 major 2022 events) to offset event set up costs. (This was approved on 3/12/2022 by the Exec committee for General Membership approval).

· Motion #3 Approve Healing Heroes as our 3rd Focus Charity after Vicki Curtis' presentation at the next General Meeting. Healing Heroes will be our Warbird Focus Charity.

Motion #4 Restate AMOS Bylaw, Article 4, Section 1, Number 13 which states "Helicopters can be flown at the Control Line area or Cross-Wind Runway at the North end of the field" to "Helicopters can be flown off the designated Heli-pad area AND off the main runway ONLY after verbal approval from all fixed wing aircraft pilots. No fixed wing aircraft take-offs or landings are allowed once the Helicopter pilot has taken off.

Motion #5 Restate AMOS Bylaw, Article 4, Section 1, Number 1 which states “Prior to flying, a pilot will attach his AMOS membership card to his person in a visible place. 72 MHz and 50 MHz pilots will put there AMA card on the appropriate pin in the frequency board” to “Prior to flying, a pilot will attach his AMOS membership card to his person in a visible place. Pilots flying on any frequency band other than 2.4 GHz must verbally confirm with all other pilots at the field that they are not flying on the same non- 2.4 GHz frequency.”

· Motion #6 Strike AMOS Bylaw, Article 4, Section 3, in its entirety. This Bylaw addresses the remediation of 2 pilots operating on the same frequency, causing damage to the aircraft. Because we have so few (if any) pilots still using 72 MHz and 50 MHz this language is no longer needed.

·Event Updates:

Float Fly- Brochure approved. At printers and will be distributed to hobby shops the week of April 10th. FB has been updated.

Currently building a 3D Flier. Tim Hanstein (Northwest Hobbies) is the anchor point.

Currently building Heli Flyer with Greggor McGrath and Danny Juarez who are anchor points. GiGi's House is the target charity for this event.

Warbirds- Dave to reach out to Rick Maita for help and event coordination. Healing Heroes will be our target charity for this event. Dave is working with Suzette on marketing Flier.

Marketing Literature and Membership Updates:AMOS Membership and 2022 Event Brochures have been mailed to the general membership. They have been distributed to hobby shops and posted on FB as well. Supply in the frequency box.

Business Cards and Update Letter has been mailed to General Membership. Supply in the frequency box.

Field Improvements Updates:

Balance of trusses has been installed and painted. 5 Sail shades went up today.

Safety Fence has been re-built putting the “safety bar” in line with the fence so there are no projections

General Updates:

Mandatory Annual Audit was conducted and completed on March 4th by an appointed committee

Andrew has agreed to update Member Badges to include Jet Waiver and CD Status

Request to General Membership for more trainers

Carlos is confirming all TW Pilots are updated and signed off as responsible parties fully aware of all safety precautions. He will keep these records on file.

Dick Brace is building 6 “round tables” for our shade area poles. AMOS has voted and agreed to pay a maximum of \$1,000 towards this effort. Dave Long will pay the balance.

General Meeting Recap – 10am 4/16/2021 AMOS field

New Business:

Acceptance of March general meeting minutes. Motion was made and passed.

Motions:

Guest speakers Stefany Hill of the “Placer Breast Cancer Foundation” and Gloria Curtis representing “Healing Heroes” made presentations explaining the functions of their organizations. Both charities are conducted by 100% volunteers, with

all proceeds going to their causes, and were deemed more than worthy beneficiaries by our members to participate in one of our major events this coming season.

Motions were made and passed to accept “Healing Heroes” and “Placer Breast Cancer Foundation” to be dedicated charities for our Warbird and 3D events respectively.

Motions were also made by Dave and seconded/passed to accept “Wounded Warriors” and “GIGIs’ House” for our Warbird and Heli events respectively.

Motion was made by Dave to approve drone racing at our field for a trial period of 1 year under the supervision/observation by Tommy Rico, who put on a stellar demonstration at our last general meeting. Motion was seconded and passed.

Event Updates

Fred Light reported some success with his first pattern event which included 13 contestants and many spectators, despite the heavy winds that day. More promotion is on task for next years’ event,

*John Sorenson stated that we still **needs a 12’ to 14’ Aluminum boat** for this years’ Float Fly. John also wants the word to go out that he will need **volunteers** to handle money, etc..*

*Dave wants it noted to all members that we need **MORE TRAINERS!***

I have included these excerpts from Daves’ agenda for this meeting in the interest of accurate reporting:

Float Fly- Brochure approved and distributed to hobby shops. FB has been updated. Currently building a 3D Flier. Tim Hanstein (Northwest Hobbies) is the anchor point. Currently building Heli Flier with Greggor McGrath and Danny Juarez who are anchor points.

AMOS Membership, 2022 Event Brochures, Business Cards and Update Letter have been mailed to general membership. All but the Update Letter has been distributed to hobby shops and posted on FB as well. Extra Supply will be kept in the frequency box.

Field Improvements Updates:

Balance of trusses have been installed and will be painted the week of April 11th. 6 Sail shades went up 4/5/2022.

Safety Fence has been re-built putting the “safety bar” in line with the fence so there are no projections

•General Updates:

Mandatory Annual Audit was conducted and completed on March 4th by appointed committee

Andrew will be updating Member Badges to include Jet Waiver and CD Status. He will also provide the Board Members with a different color badge, so we are more easily identifiable. Plus he is creating the badge for trainers in yet a 3rd color, so trainers will be more easily identifiable.

Carlos is confirming all TW Pilots are updated and signed off as responsible parties fully aware of all safety precautions. He will keep these records on file.

Dick Brace is building 6 “round tables” for our shade area poles. AMOS has voted and agreed to pay a maximum of \$1,000 (from 2021 Budget) towards this effort. Dave Long will pay the balance.

Dave is going to plan a meeting, possibly dinner, for discussion with trainers. The focus will be to, basically, make sure all trainers are in sync and on the “same page” regarding training techniques, protocols, etc..

As of now, Andrew has issued blue badges to AMOS board members and green badges to turbine waiver approved members. Trainer badge colors to follow soon.

Miscellaneous topics of discussion:

Keith Fick reported that mowing the field is on hold due rain soaked soil.

Trainers are responsible for providing and for maintenance of their own equipment.

Steve Stanley has set up a date for a meeting with the Roseville School District to discuss what AMOS is all about. Dave stated that he has crafted a powerpoint presentation for said meeting. Steve also suggested that the Pattern Event would have benefited by having an announcer, following discussions suggested an announcer and PA system should be provided for all events.

Jody stated he was inquiring about a financial institution that perhaps provided some interest on some \$60k in our AMOS account. Jody also mentioned possible AMA certification for instructors.

Andrew stated that our AMOS membership presently stands at 249 total, of which 211 have paid their renewal fee and 37 have as of yet renewed their membership.

Dave mentioned he was fabricating banners.

Also expressed the need for more flight instructors.
